THEFT AND VANDALISM

Background

The Division believes that incidents of theft and vandalism to property of the Division must be handled in an appropriate manner.

Procedures

- 1. All employees of Livingstone Range School Division are expected to take appropriate steps to secure and protect Division property.
- 2. All employees of the Division who become aware of vandalism or theft shall immediately report the same to their supervisor.
- 3. Principals, at their discretion, should report theft or vandalism to the Superintendent's office as soon as possible after discovery.
- 4. In cases of major theft or vandalism, the Principal shall report the matter immediately to the police detachment responsible for the school's community, and then notify the Superintendent's office.
- 5. If a student does not voluntarily make restitution for intentional damage, destruction, or theft of Division property, a claim may be laid against parents or guardians to recover costs. This process will be handled through the Superintendent's office.
- 6. In cases of minor theft or vandalism, every effort should be made to resolve the problem internally, and especially so in first offence situations.
