Following are the Board of Trustees Key Messages from the Board of Trustees Regular Meeting held on Tuesday, April 17, 2018.

1) Livingstone School Annual Results and Ski Academy Presentation

Mr. Chad Jensen, Principal of Livingstone School presented the Annual Education Results and Plan to the Board of Trustees. Mr. Jensen began his presentation outlining the schools Mission, Vision and Motto, highlighting their Motto - 'It's Personal' and what it means: 1) Practices are driven by relationships, 2) Classrooms are inclusive; 3) Instruction is differentiated; 4) Programming is flexible to meet student needs, and 5) Students are supported and challenged. Focusing on their school profile, Values and Beliefs, Mr. Jensen noted their school is designed for Ideal Graduation Qualities.

Mr. Jensen spoke of the Livingstone Schools plan for school improvement. He reviewed the data collected from the Accountability Pillar, PAT and DIP results, Our Survey Data Results and Qualitative Data and spoke on the areas of strength, areas of improvement and areas for growth. Additionally he reviewed Goal Setting, Goal 1) *Personalize the educational experience for all students* and, Goal 2) *Provide innovative learning opportunities for all students*, their strategies and measures. Mr. Jensen concluded his presentation by talking about the schools successes and celebrations.
