Generally we live following the medical response model of corrections when it comes to our mental health. We wait until something feels wrong and seek to correct it. The rest of the time we simply 'hope for the best.' From the point of view of the teaching of Windhorse ("Lungta" in Tibetan), we are doing it backwards. Instead of waiting until we find ourselves in an emotional and spiritual hole, we could instead look to constantly raise our "inner wind" as a way of establishing the equanimity to deal with disturbances (what we often refer to as anxiety) in our lives; like a skilled equestrian we can train in balance and inner confidence so that when we meet with obstacles we feel able to incorporate these obstacles into the ride itself. Windhorse is essentially the bright and clear energy of our basic and fundamental human sanity. It is not conditioned or reliant on 'everything going right today.' Lungta is invoked by bringing the mind and body together in little self-induced environments of meditation.

In this session we will discuss Windhorse (Lungta) and engage in its meditational practices. For this we sit in chairs. It's possible that we may practice windhorse yoga- which does not involve still poses but instead more reliant on flowing movements and coordinated breathing that shift inner prana.
