There is a 2000 year old meditative tradition from Tibet called, "The Indestructible Path" that actually regards anxiety as 'good news' (lot). In other words, fear, resentment, fixation, worry and even hiding from reality are viewed as very workable situations; stress as an energy flow directly produced by the richness of our human experience.

Normally we would consider a path of mindfulness or needitation (same thing, really) as a way to shield ourselves from harsh realities, to make them go away, help us forget the world or even empower us to suppress our aggressors. The "indestructible Path" teaches us about the possibility that discomfort could contain wisdom and maybe even be our teacher. A good analogy is that of farming. A skillful farmer uses stinky, smelly manure to fertilize the crops, thus producing vegetables that can be used to feed his family. With meditation as a path we can work directly with the *manure* of our human experience.

In this session we will discuss the basis for the "path of stress" through transmission of traditional teachings, discussion, nowness-open ended meditation, and some movement in the form of Tibetan Yoga.
