



SCIENCE ICE WALK

Discover the world of hydrology. How do the different water systems work with our natural work? Become a scientist-in-training as we walk up to Star Creek Falls, and learn about how the different forms of water and how it interacts with each other.

Grades 4-12 Location: Crowsnest Pass Duration: 2.5 hours Cost: \$40/student Min. 8 students / Max. 20 students

PLANT IDENTIFICATION

The wildflowers around Crowsnest Pass are incredible and the biodiversity is very high in this part of the Canadian Rockies. Learn the different parts of a wildflower in order to learn how to identify plants. Then go out on a nature hike to work on your newly developed skills.

NAVIGATION COURSES

MAP READING

Learn the different parts of a topographic map and what they mean. What are the symbols, colours, and how does this information work? Topographic maps contain a lot of information, and can be a helpful tool to explore the outdoors.

ORIENTEERING & USING A COMPASS

Review or learn the different parts of a compass and how to use it. Transfer these skills onto an orienteering course to discover how to use a compass with a map.

Grades 6-8 Location: In-class and outdoor Duration: 4 hours

Cost: \$30/student Min. 8 students / Max. 30 students Prerequisite: Map Reading

USING COMPASS & TOPOGRAPHIC MAPS TO TRIP PLAN

Review or learn the different parts of a compass and how to use it and calibrate it. Learn to read coordinates from the topographic map and use all of this information to create your own trip plan. Next, go outside and practice these skills.

NAVIGATION: USING TECHNOLOGY

Learn the different options for navigating outdoors using modern-day technology, and learn about their limitations and advantages. Create your own trip plan using this information and then go outside to explore using what you learned.
