Due to Covid-19, public health measures were put in place and continue to be in effect to some extent. The AHS checklist was developed to support schools in reducing the risk of transmission of COVID-19 among attendees and staff. They are meant to assist with assessing attendees who may be symptomatic, or who may have been exposed to someone who is ill or has confirmed COVID-19.

9:55-10:05 E.5 Advocacy

- Alberta Health Services amended their <u>AHS Checklist</u> February 22, 2022. If a student has a core symptom, there is a legal requirement for them to be isolated, for up to 10 days from the day of onset of symptoms or until symptoms resolve, whichever is longer.
- Many parents continue to follow the AHS Checklist and guidelines, keeping their children home for a core symptom, regardless of Covid-19 testing results.
- Literacy and numeracy, especially in the earliest grades, is an important foundation for all future learning with research showing the foundation needs to be in place by the end of Grade 3.
- With such extended absences for some students, a significant amount of instructional time is being missed.

- With such a high rate of absences, teachers and administrators need to be mindful of programming to ensure they are teaching all curriculum outcomes.
- Collective bargaining agreements stipulate how many hours teachers work and they cannot and should not be asked to do additional support for Covid-19 interruptions
- With the return to in-class learning, at-home, virtual resources are not available for students to make up the missed instructional time.

Recommendation:

That the board of trustees direct Advocacy Committee to write a letter, to the Minister of Education, Minister of Health, and the AHS Advocacy Councils (Prairie Mountain Health Advisory Council and Oldman River Health Advisory Council), asking to review the AHS Checklist, specifically in regards to how it affects student's attendance, the resulting learning gap and lack of resources to cover missed learning outcomes now and in the future.
