BACKGROUND



From February 12-19, 2024 all Grade 10-12 students and all parents of Grade 10-12 students were invited to participate in the February 2024 Student Success Plan Measurement Survey via Survey Monkey.

The survey sought feedback on the 21st Century Knowledge, Skills, & Attributes (Life Skills) area goals that 1) All students have access to career and life preparation programming, and 2) LRSD schools continue to offer robust off campus programs.



Q1 What is your relationship to Livingstone Range School Division?




PARTICIPANTS BY SCHOOL

- "Great for getting course load advice in relation to preparing for post secondary applications." (Parent)

- (15) I/my child does not require any assistance in career planning at this time
- (15) My/my child's schedule has been too busy to meet with the Career Practitioner yet
- (16) Other comments include scheduling with Career Practitioner, student reluctance, international student status

Q10: If you have not participated in Off Campus Programming, why not?


- (18) I am unaware that I/my child has access to a Off Campus opportunities at school
