  - a. **2023-2025 FACES Registration** Jordan Gunderson, Director of Finance, presented a 2023-2025 FACES Registration Review. FACES is a Livingstone Range School Division summer school initiative. FACES consists of a 3 year program; 1<sup>st</sup> Year (Challenge), 2<sup>nd</sup> year (Journey) and 3<sup>rd</sup> year (Service). Over the last 3 years the FACES registration has continuously increased and the capacity has now increased to 640 available spots throughout the 5 weeks of summer sessions. The program is in very high demand and all sessions were filled within 17 days of opening with a waiting list for attendees.
  - b. Southwest Skills Competition Chad Kuzyk, Associate Superintendent, Programs & Innovation presented to the Board regarding the Southwest Skills competition. The top performers that participated in the 2025 Regional Skills Canada Alberta Competition for the Southwest Alberta Region are now advancing and will be attending the Provincial Skills Canada competition in Edmonton, May 7 & 8, 2025. These students showed off their skills in hairstyling, baking, video production, culinary arts, cabinet making, and carpentry, competing against other high school students from southwestern Alberta.

The Inclusive Learning portfolio includes, division learning services, curriculum and assessments, collaborative response, inclusive planning/behaviour support, supports and services for students, English as an additional language, inspiring leadership, professional learning, teacher evaluations and early learning. Our division learning services team includes; the Deputy Superintendent, Director of Learning, Inclusive Learning Coach/Early Learning Supervisor, Clinic Team Lead, LRSD Principal of Colony Schools & Pursuits and the Assistant principals/Learning Support Teachers. The team works collaboratively to collect data, plan, structure, framework, processes, continuum of supports and interventions to support our The team also utilizes supports and services from South West students. Collaborative Support Services, a LRSD Speech-Language Pathologist and Key Connections Consulting Behaviour Support. Inclusive learning needs are continually growing throughout the division. These supports and services are critical in terms of helping LRSD support students with a wide range of needs.
